



St Clare's College is committed to providing a safe and empowering environment for all students. In our community, learning is valued and students are given opportunities to grow in all dimensions of their life. College staff support students to achieve their personal best. Our aim is for every student to flourish – not only while they are at school, but also in their future endeavours.

Responsibilities of Senior Students

All senior students are leaders within the College. This confers additional responsibilities, including:

- Demonstrating a mature and professional approach to their learning and the capacity to balance competing demands
- Leading the development of a network of positive relationships within the student community
- Modelling the values of fraternity, compassion, and respect in their interactions with others.

Senior students must:

- Be present and on time to all scheduled classes, including Pastoral Care, in line with BSSS requirements
- Attend all Extended Pastoral Care lessons and major College events, such as Masses, Liturgies, Carnivals, and Community Days.
- They are encouraged to use their study lines appropriately.

Any absences must be supported by documentation in line with the College Attendance Policy.

Year 11 Students

In Term One, Year 11 students are required to be on campus from 8.55am-3.25pm. This is to enable them to develop healthy study habits and adjust to using non-scheduled lesson times appropriately, ensuring success in their studies. This arrangement is reviewed at the end of term.

Year 11 Students (Term 2 onwards) and Year 12 Students

Senior students may be off campus during study lines and break times provided that:

- They have the consent of their parents / carers (see signature block below)
- They adhere to their commitments as senior students under this agreement
- They do not depart campus during Recess – the reasons for this is the short period of time between the end of Period 2 and the movement bell before Pastoral Care. Students with a study lesson in Period 2 may extend their time away into Recess, but they are expected to return on time to Pastoral Care.

Signing In/Out

All Senior students must ensure they are signing in/out of the College via Student Attendance at Reception. The College requires this of both staff and senior students as part of our duty of care – information regarding the whereabouts of community members is vital in an emergency.

Driving Agreement

- Any student who drives to or from school must complete and sign the Driving Registration Agreement and arrange for the agreement to be signed by a parent / carer.
- Passengers in cars to and from the College remain the responsibility of parents/carers and student drivers. We encourage parents / carers to advise their daughters with whom they may or may not travel.
- Under CE policy, students cannot transport other students on school-related activities, including College organised events.

Breach of Senior Agreement

Where a student is found to have breached the Senior Agreement, consequences may apply. The purpose of any consequence will be to promote student safety and to maximise learning and community building opportunities.

Depending upon the severity of the breach, consequences could include a lunch detention, Afternoon Reflection, or revocation of permission to leave College grounds during the school day. Students who miss a community event without acceptable documented explanation will not be considered for leadership opportunities.
