Rationale/Purpose

As a Catholic community St Clare's College requires that all of its students adhere to our uniform regulations. These regulations are in place to ensure a spirit of equality among our students in their educational environment.

Policy

Enrolment at St Clare's College implies acceptance of and adherence to the following uniform regulations. It is the policy of St Clare's College that all students must reasonably adhere to uniform and personal presentation requirements. Procedures

Refer to the College website for a full list of uniform requirements. It is requested that all uniform items are clearly labelled with the student's name.

Uniform & Personal Presentation

Students are required to:

- wear the College uniform as set out in the Student Handbook
- project a positive image of the College whenever in uniform

Processes for Monitoring School Uniform

All students are expected to wear correct school uniform while at school and when travelling to and from school each day. In the event of an emergency, that prevents a student from being in correct uniform, students can obtain a Uniform Pass from their Pastoral Coordinator.

If students are in incorrect uniform, and do not have a Uniform Pass, they may be issued a consequence in line with the Positive Behaviour (Personal Best) Policy.





Changes to the St Clare's College Uniform

Uniform is the responsibility of the school. This means that the College Leadership is responsible for making decisions about what official items of uniform are and how these will be sold.

Parents, staff or students who wish to have a particular uniform item reviewed should put their case to the School Board via the College Principal for consideration.
